VOLUNTEERS

Dr. Corrie will be working on the upcoming medical and raptor trainings, as well as doing some one-on-one teaching with 3 volunteers who are seeking their own rehabilitation permits.

DONATIONS & NEEDS

A shipping container was donated to us, which will provide us with much needed storage space and allow us to free up some room in the animal care building.

We are starting to organize winter project work parties for tasks that need to be completed during a time that we are less busy with animal care. The following are projects that need to be done:

- Install shelves and lighting in the new storage container.
- Reorganization once the storage container is ready (safe storage of food bags, release caging and rummage sale items)
- Old horse stalls need to be reconfigured so that they may be used as actual caging (we will create a list of needed building supplies to add to our wish list)
- Preparing the outdoor cages for the winter season
- Deep cleaning and organizing the center

THE WILDLIFE

We received a Barred owl with head trauma. After it was stabilized, we transferred the owl to West Sound Wildlife Shelter. It recovered and was released in the area where it was found.

A Barred owl with a wing injury came to us from OVS, and it was also transferred to West Sound Wildlife Shelter. It is doing well and will be released when it has fully recovered.

A juvenile auklet is doing well after joining several other juvenile auklets at Discovery Bay Wild Bird Rescue. We were able to stabilize it and transfer it to West Sound Wildlife Shelter and then on to Discovery Bay.
